

Here's what is allowed in schools:

1. You can make an announcement about the measure at your* Back to School Night event or PTA Meetings* held on school sites (see the attached script).
 - The announcement must be fact-based. You cannot tell anyone to vote "YES" on Proposition A.
 - It's OK to say, "Prop A is on the ballot this November to raise money to improve the 50 remaining school buildings. Please take a handout home with you tonight".
 - If you are a school on the list (list attached or view the map at <http://repairsfschools.org/about/>), you can announce that the school will be receiving upgrades.
2. You can also *hand out the "school approved" fact sheet* attached – at all schools and through the school Wednesday envelopes.
3. Through your *next PTA email communication or a PTA website*, you can promote the initiative. You are allowed to talk about the bond initiative and tell people to vote "YES" on Proposition A through PTA moderated list serves because Prop A has been approved and endorsed through the District PTA. You can even vote to have your PTA's name added to the list of supporting organizations. (email legislative@sfpta.org if you have questions)
4. You can *hand out promotional material* on the sidewalk, so please identify a parent who will have house signs in their car to give to people as they leave school. Promotional material is available
 - through the District PTA at president@sfpta.org
 - at the Parents for Public Schools office at 3543 18th Street at Valencia
 - through the Yes on A website at www.repairsfschools.org by emailing repairsfschools@gmail.com.

Here is what is NOT allowed on school grounds:

1. *Campaigning is not allowed in schools* – you cannot tell people to vote one way or the other on this initiative or any other race
2. You cannot advocate to vote for the initiative while on school grounds during the school day or during school sponsored events, including an onsite
3. PTA Meeting (unless you have a paid special use permit).
4. You cannot distribute house signs or promotional material (anything that says yes on A) on school grounds.
