Equitable Access



Families have information they need to make informed decisions about their children and schools

- 4,000 families participated in enrollment workshops and received 1:1 information and support
- 94% of enrollment workshop participants learned things to make the enrollment process easier

Equitable Engagement



Families are advocates and leaders who support their students and are involved in decision-making

- 1,100 families gained knowledge and leadership skills in family engagement and education programs
- Our first Family Leader Board cohort members completed their one-year terms, gaining skills, connections, knowledge, and experience to help them continue supporting their communities

Capacity for Equity



Voices and needs of lower income families are elevated; families and SFUSD work together to create more equitable school policies and systems

- 3,000 people attended reopening town halls organized in partnership with SFUSD, SF Department of Public Health, and 2nd District PTA
- 600 people gave PPS-SF feedback on SFUSD's revised student assignment system, with a successful focus on gathering input from families in the Bayview, Excelsior, and Mission District
